High level of accreditation recognizes organization's dedication and commitment to improving the quality of lives for those served

ALEXANDRIA, Va., June 10, 2024—[NSITE](#), the talent management enterprise launched by [National Industries for the Blind](#) in 2021, provides a continuum of employment services that connect employers with talented, dedicated people who are blind or visually impaired, including veterans. Recently NSITE received accreditation by [CARF](#), an independent, nonprofit accreditor of health and human services, enhancing the lives of persons served worldwide.

The organization’s services are provided remotely, and its business systems are built and implemented with full accessibility as the priority. The initiatives the organization is working on with major technology providers are anticipated to ultimately impact NSITE’s services and all clients who access technology as part of their lives.”

“We are delighted to have earned this three-year accreditation and recognition from CARF,” said Jonathan Lucas, executive director of NSITE. “Through our services and our collaborations and partnerships, NSITE has been able to play a significant role in ensuring employment for many people who are blind or low vision, people who are talented, educated, and ready to work but need access to meaningful career opportunities.”
